#### Principal's Report cont....

Thank you Kerry and Pat for all you do for our school.

Breakfast Club Times – As a reminder, Breakfast Club is open to students from 8.15am. Students should not be arriving to school before then. There is no-one available to take duty of care for your children before this time so no students should be on site.

Indigenous Artwork on Totem Poles – As part of our commitment to Cultural Responsiveness, local artist, Kevin Bynder, recently painted the poles in the courtyard. He has added colour and story to the poles and I encourage you to take a closer look as photos simply don't do them justice.





**RAC incursions** - All students from Pre-primary to Year 6 had the opportunity of taking part in an RAC safety incursion. Each year group had a different focus. Throughout all the incursions, the measure around road safety was clear. With it being school holidays next week, please share the message of road safety with your children as we want to see all our students return to school on Monday 15 July safe and injury free.

Movie Reward Day - Well done to the students who maintained Good Standing at the end of the term and were invited to join us for a Movie and free dress Pyjama day. Good Standing is afforded to all students at the start of every term and it is the responsibility of students to maintain that status. A letter was sent out to all parents explaining Good standing and the ways in which good standing is lost. We will take the opportunity during Semester 2 to create a Positive Behaviour Policy which will set out processes and procedures relating to managing behaviour at school. Members of our PBS Leadership Team attended Professional Learning on Tuesday and will be working together in developing our positive learning environment. We will be working with students, staff and families in developing our policies. Positive Behaviour Support is a whole school responsibility and I thank all parents and carers for their support when challenges are faced by individual students.

# Free Internet for Unconnected Families with School-Aged Students

The Australian Government School Student Broadband Initiative (SSBI) is offering free home internet for eligible families with school-aged students until 31 December 2025.

To be eligible, families must:

- have no active broadband service
- have a device capable of accessing the internet
- live in premises where they can access a standard NBN service
- have a child living at home who is enrolled in an Australian school.

The free broadband starts from the day the service is activated with a participating internet provider. Families will not be placed on a paid service by the internet provider at the end of the free service without consent.

If you think you are eligible and want to self-nominate for the free broadband offer:






