PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

Dear Parent Community

Last Monday 31 July, the children who had maintained their good behaviour standing for the first two weeks of Term 3 were treated to a sausage sizzle as a reward. This term we have decided to trial the use of a substantial reward every two weeks instead of the usual reward at the end of the term. We were finding that some of the children, particularly the younger children, could not relate to a reward given almost three months in the future. The next reward will be an extended play at the beginning of Week 5.

Children who lost their good standing for the first two weeks of the term, based on the number of office referrals they received, will have their good standing restored for the beginning of the next two-week cycle. Children who were suspended in the first two weeks of the term will have their good standing returned at the beginning of Week 6. Children who were suspended twice in the first two weeks of school will have their good standing returned at the beginning of Term 4.

We have also 'upped the ante' with our ROAR Card draws. The children are given a ROAR Values card instantly recognising and rewarding a behaviour which supports our values of **R**espect, **O**wnership (of their actions) **A**chievement and **R**esilience (ROAR). The cards are placed in a weekly draw for the opportunity to win a small prize. This is still occurring. To give these cards even greater value we are collecting all the cards from the weekly draw and running a raffle for more substantial prizes every five weeks. The prizes will include vouchers for the Friday lunches organised by our P&C, family passes to the movies and the like. Irrespective of their good standing status, all children are eligible to win a ROAR card prize.

This term we are also taking a more proactive stance against physical violence. Children who hit other children will be suspended. Unfortunately this has meant we have had a substantial rise in overall suspensions for the term. Our previous process of using detentions or in school suspensions was not having the desired outcome in reducing the aggressive behaviour of some of our more reactive children. Our more direct approach to addressing aggressive student behaviour is supported by the recent statement "Standing Together Against Violence" from Education Minister Tony Buti. We are closely monitoring and supporting children who return to school after a suspension to help them change their behaviour and not use physical violence as their first response to a situation or disagreement.

I am accustomed to dealing with the behaviour of children, but unfortunately, I must also sometimes have to address the behaviours of Parents or Carers. There have been several incidents recently in which parents have confronted other parents about child related issues whilst on the school grounds. This is unacceptable and will not be tolerated. These issues must be referred to us to be dealt with. Further incidents of this nature will result in the offending parties being prohibited from entering school grounds for a period of between 30 and 90 days. This includes the carpark. I would rather not have to take this action but will do so without hesitation if behaviour of this nature continues.

I thank you for your support and understanding as we work towards ensuring our school is a safe and supportive environment for all of our children and parents.
