PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

Dear Parent Community

As the term draws to a close, we are starting to review the approach we have taken to address student misbehaviour. Our approach was twofold, the first being an increase in the use of positive incentives to encourage good behaviour, but also an increase in negative sanctions, particularly the use of suspensions for major or extreme behaviours, particularly physical violence. As a staff we will be discussing the overall success of the different approach and any adjustments or changes we need to implement moving forward at our next School Development Day, Monday 9 October, the commencement of Term 4.

I am also seeking feedback from our parent community as to how successful or otherwise this approach has been and any suggestions for improving how we manage the children's behaviour at school. This will be undertaken using a survey which will be in out in Week 9. The survey should only take a few minutes and will be invaluable in ensuring the views of our families are carefully considered in any future plans we develop.

The next few weeks will be very busy. Term 3 usually is. The Colour Fun Run will be going ahead as planned on Tuesday 19 September. There has been some confusion as two dates have been bandied around. Some of this confusion has been caused by the movable date of our Faction Sports Carnival. To ensure fairness we have been using finishing gates at our previous Faction Carnivals, which record exactly when children cross the line in their races, rather than rely on us trying to judge it. As you can guess these gates are in hot demand. We had originally booked them for Thursday, 14 September, which was one day before our preferred date of Friday, 15 September. Unfortunately, it's everybody else's preferred date! When we confirmed the booking earlier this week, we were informed that for some reason they weren't available! We have been able to secure the gates for Thursday, 21 September which is the last Thursday of term.

I apologise for the movable feast and hope this doesn't cause too much angst with parents rearranging works shifts so they can cheer on their budding athletes.

SunSmart Tips

Exposure to ultraviolet (UV) radiation from the sun and other sources, such as solariums, is the major cause of skin cancer. Australia has some of the highest levels of UV radiation in the world: in fact UV radiation is strong enough to cause sunburn in as little as 10 minutes on a fine January day. Your skin remembers and records all the UV exposure you have ever received - all the sunburns, tans, solarium visits or just simple day-to-day time spent outdoors when you have not used sun protection. It all adds up and increases your long-term risk of skin cancer. It's estimated that if we reduce our lifetime exposure to UV radiation by just 20%, Australia would have about one third fewer cases of skin cancer.
