PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

Dear Parent Community

Where has the year gone? It's hard to believe next week is November! Before we know it, Christmas will be with us.

Last term we took a different approach to dealing with student misbehaviour. Instead of having one big reward at the end of the term we had a smaller reward every two weeks. Children who were in 'good standing', not having been suspended or had not been referred to the office twice in the two-week period, participated in the reward activity. Children who were suspended once missed out on two consecutive rewards. Children who were suspended more than twice missed out on the rewards for the remainder of the term. All children have their good standing restored at the beginning of the term. Prior to last term we also held a weekly raffle using the ROAR cards the children earn in response to good behaviour. Last term we continued the weekly draws, but then included a 'monster' draw in Week 5 and Week 10. In addition to increasing the positives we also increased the negatives, taking a tougher line on incidences of misbehaviour, particularly where violence was involved. This unfortunately led to a substantial rise in suspensions.

The new approach is working. We noted a drop in suspensions and incidences of misbehaviour generally as Term 3 progressed and the children's behaviour choices improved. Additionally, the number of individual children being suspended for the first three weeks of this term, as compared to last term has dropped dramatically, which is very pleasing.

The first reward for Term 4 was the sausage sizzle last Monday. The next reward will be an extended play time and healthy icy pole at the beginning of Week 5. The reward for Week 7 will be a water play session, weather permitting and the grand finale will be the Movie Reward in Week 10.

Many years ago, the school commenced a sun safe hat policy with the introduction of a bucket hat in the school colours. The hat is important in providing sun protection but is also a vital aid in keeping track of the children, particularly if we are on an excursion and not all of the children are wearing full school uniform. The uniform hat is particularly useful when we are on camp and the children are not wearing their unforms.

The first hat is issued free or charge when the children are first enrolled and commence attending Coolbellup Community School. I am noticing many children at recess and lunchtime do not have their hat. This is particularly concerning as the hotter weather approaches. Many of the children I have spoken with tell me that their hat is at home. School hats are to remain at school. Please have a conversation with your child regarding the state/presence/whereabouts of their hat. Next week we will conduct a search of the school to re-unite children with their hats as well. If between school and home we are still unable to find the hat, I will be asking parents to replace it. The cost is \$11 for a new hat.
