#### PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

**Dear Parent Community** 

Thank you to the many parents who attended the Meet the Teacher sessions after school on Tuesday. Feedback I received from parents and staff about these meetings was very positive. The meetings were well attended and lots of great questions were posed. The hand out notes prepared by each teacher are a handy guide to familiarise parents and carers with the routines and procedures for each classroom. It is also a good opportunity for teachers and parents to meet face to face, particularly for our new parents.

I have been particularly pleased to see so many of our children dressed in school uniform. I would like to thank parents and carers for their continued support in this regard.

This year our swimming lessons were much earlier than normal. Each year we register the school for In-term Swimming and are allowed to nominate a preferred time and venue. Our preference is for a summer spot in Term 1 and our least favourite preference is for a winter spot in Term 3. We also prefer the lessons are compacted to one week rather than two as it halves the costs to our families.

This week our hard-working P&C re-launched Crunch and Sip. Each morning the children are offered a selection of fruits and vegetables to eat during a short 'brain-break' from their learning. We are evaluating this trial in the view to making it a long-term proposition.

# Crunch&Sip\*

We are still seeing a stream of late arrivals to school each day. I understand the pressures in getting children ready in the morning, but it is vital that the children arrive at school before classes start at 8:45am. The 'sweet spot' for arrival at school is 8:30am. This gives the children time to prepare for the day. The sweet spot for arriving at school for Breakfast Club is 8:15am.

Despite the interruptions caused by our early swimming lesson schedule we have had a very smooth start to the year. I am grateful to our teachers and support staff for helping to make this happen. Our Front Office staff, Mrs Gandossi, Mrs McNally and Mrs Schulz have done an amazing job to ensure all of the important administrative arrangements such as enrolments and swimming were handled with calm professionalism and good humour.

I am looking forward to a busy and productive term.
