Sorry Day/Reconciliation Week

We held our annual Sorry Day Service last week. Thank you to all our community members who attended as well as to our staff who were involved in its preparation. This was my first Sorry Day Service at Coolbellup Community School (CCS) and I felt honoured to observe how it ran. It is clear it is a very important service for our community. This week is Reconciliation Week and it is an opportunity for us to learn more about our shared histories, cultures and achievements. This year's theme is 'Now More than Ever' with CCS continuing to work on our Reconciliation Action Plan in order for it to be published this year.

Thank you to the P&C - Last Friday was P&C Day, which was an opportunity to say THANK YOU to all the volunteers who are involved in our P&C. Our schools rely on the support of P&Cs to raise much needed funds as well as run programs and events for our students. CCS and CLC P&C do an amazing job at running the much-needed Breakfast Club and preparing daily Crunch 'n' Sip. Thank you to the Executive Team who coordinate the projects and events.

COVID/Winter Bugs - With Autumn upon us, we have seen an increase in cold viruses amongst our students. We encourage all students to cover their mouth and nose when sneezing and coughing to help stop the spread.

Healthy WA provides the following tips to help prevent the spread of germs;

	Cover coughs and sneezes with your inner elbow or use a tissue and throw it in the bin straight away.

Breakfast Club - We are very lucky to have a Breakfast Club for our students to access. Students can access breakfast from 8.15am. Breakfast Club aims to provide additional food to students who might still be hungry when getting to school. We know that students need a full tummy to learn; Breakfast Club is so important for all our students. There is always plenty of choice with cold and hot options offered. Food portions are standard ensuring that there is enough to go around for everyone who needs it; thank you for supporting the Breakfast Club team. Volunteers are always needed, so please let a member of the Breakfast Club team know if you have time available in the mornings to help.

Uniform - This week, families have been sent a copy of the Uniform policy, which was last reviewed in 2022. There are many reasons why schools have a uniform; one of them being for the health and safety of students. We ask that students do not wear crocs at school as they do not provide students with the support that sneakers provide and are not as anti-slip. We also ask families look at the section relating to the wearing of jewellery.

School start times – The first siren of the day is at 8.45. This is when our students start learning. Many thanks to the families who arrive to school for the start of the day. Did you know that if your child is late by 15 minutes every day, this equates to 14 days of lost learning a year? We would love to support students who regularly arrive late to school. We will be reaching out to families very soon.

Curiosity Club Specialists in Training



Fremantle College's Curiosity Club is an after school program which offers hands-on extension opportunities for students in Year 5.

Curiosity Club Specialist ICT

The ICT program supports students to develop their design and problem-solving skills, and expand their creativity. They will have access to industry standard technology as they undertake a design and create process, developing a tangible product.

Curiosity Club Specialist Marine Science

The Marine Science program encourages students to further their understanding of the marine environment, and the impact we have on it. They will undertake a range of scientific investigations, drawing upon skills in chemistry, physics and biology.

Our Curiosity Club will run for three sessions and take place in Terms 3 and 4. When applying, students are able to select which term they wish to attend, and they are able to apply for both programs. Specialist teaching staff facilitate all sessions, supported by our Specialist Program Student Leaders.

Application Process

Students are required to complete the application form and return to Fremantle College by Friday 14 June 2024. Online form is available on our college website, under Enrolments and Curiosity Club. The college will advise the outcome of all applications at the end of Term 3 and distribute information to families.




