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PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

Dear Coolbellup Community School families

I hope you've had a good couple of weeks since our last newsletter. Winter is certainly upon us with it being a lot chillier and wetter than it has been recently.

We are looking forward to LA10's assembly next week.

Winter Carnival –Year 4, 5 and 6 students took part in the annual CDSSA Winter Carnival today. Whilst I won't know how well our students went at the time of the newsletter being published, I am sure the students represented themselves and the school with pride. Thanks to Ms Mottram and the involvement of the Year 4, 5 and 6 teachers for making the day possible. There will be more about the carnival in the next newsletter.

Student Wellbeing – With Term 2 being 11 weeks, students will be feeling more tired than normal at the end of the term. We are having a Well-Being Week where students will be participating in several different activities which promote positive wellbeing. RAC Little Legends Club will be delivering a free incursion to all students around safety during the week as well as teachers completing activities with their students. The Department of Education recently sent a document to schools outlining the future direction of work for students in this space. The department has identified different ways schools can have a real impact on the wellbeing of students. Staff at Coolbellup Community School will be looking at the document more closely to see what we can do to promote positive wellbeing for our students. If you have any ideas which you would like to share with me, please get in touch.

Positive Behaviour Support – Staff took part in a presentation with the School of Special Educational Needs – Behaviour and Engagement on Wednesday afternoon as part of a staff meeting, relating to Positive Behaviour Support (PBS). PBS is a framework aligned to the Department of Education's policy. Positive Behaviour Support builds a continuum of supports for staff and students with an emphasis on building relationships. We have made a commitment to review and amend current documentation which refers to behaviour, including the Good Standing Policy. More information will be sent in due course. You will have received an updated Good Standing Policy earlier today.

End of Semester Reports – End of Semester Reports are due out at the end of next week. We will be emailing them to you as well as printing them out, as usual. By emailing them, you can download them and save them onto your device/computer. This will allow you to send reports to high schools as part of their enrolment processes. This is a process common in all other government primary schools and I think you will find it very useful. For you to receive the email, please check we have your current email address on our system.

School Development Day Term 3 - Reminder

A School Development Day for Term 3 has been set for Friday 16 August (Week 5). This was set before I became the principal at the school but may have been communicated as being the first day of Term 3. Monday 15 July is a normal school day for students at Coolbellup Community School.

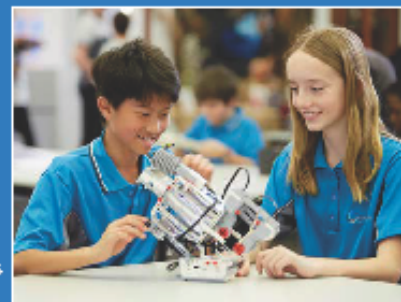

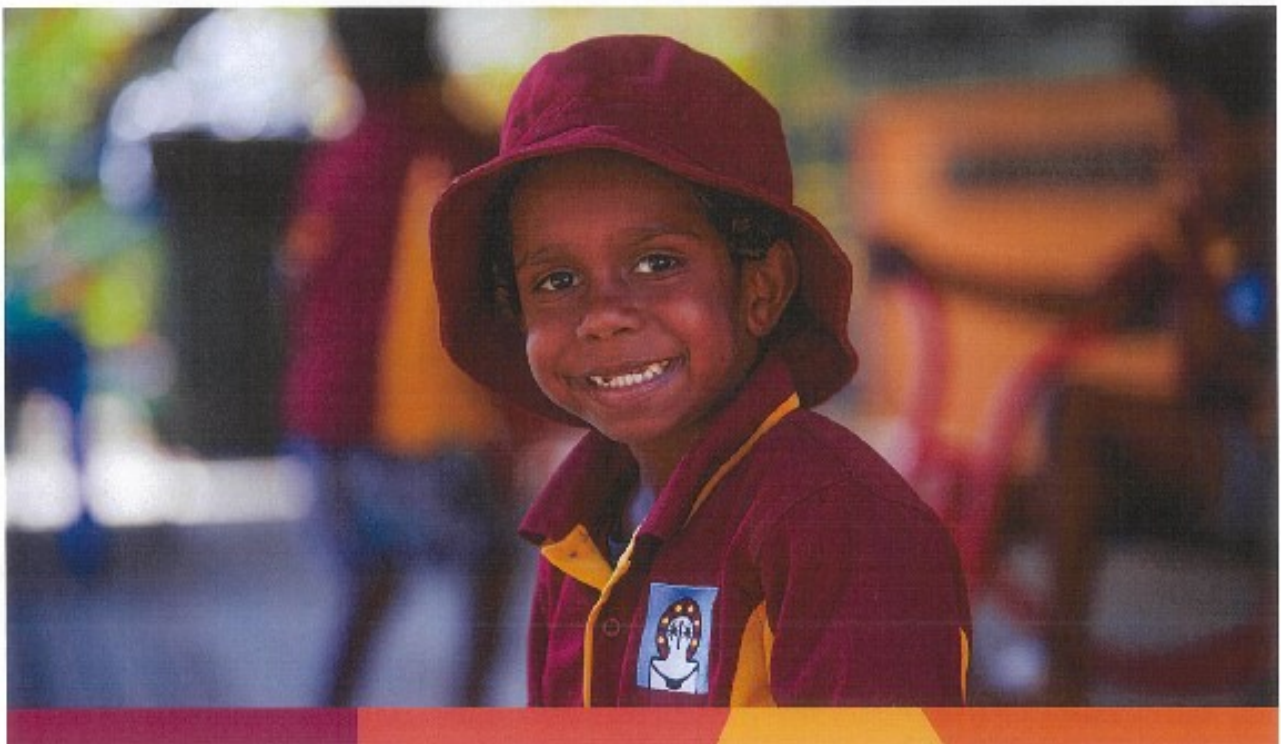

Please ensure you keep the school up to date with your current phone number and address.

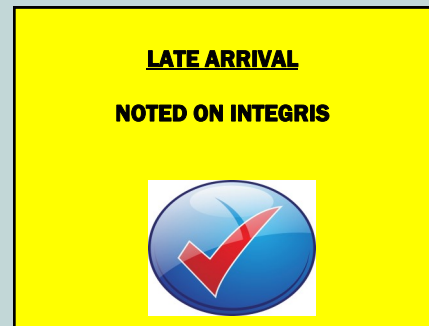
This information is vital should we need to contact you in an emergency.
